Chair Evans adjourns Closed Session at 10:37 a.m. and reconvenes in Regular Session at 1:30 p.m. with all Supervisors present.

1:30 P.M. WORKSHOP

Chair Evans declares a recess at 1:32 p.m. and states that they are now sitting as the Colusa County Flood Control and Water conservation District with all Directors present.

1. Chair Evans makes time for discussion and possible direction regarding Sites Reservoir and Establishment of a Zone of Benefit, as well as other items requiring Board input.

Overview:

Ms. Tyler states that the purpose today is to provide an update on the Sites Project and District activities, as well as obtaining direction on a variety of issues concerning landowner participation in the Sites Project. Direction is needed in order to complete necessary documents which are anticipated to be before the Board in the next two to six weeks for consideration.

Mr. Urkov gives the Board an update on the current status of Sites and the proposed Zone of Benefit No. 3.

Mr. King inquires what Zones 1 and 2 are?

Supervisor Evans responds that Zone 1 is West of Colusa and Zone 2 is between Maxwell and Princeton. Ms. Tyler responds that they were formed for the purpose of flood control.

Mr. King requests to have maps, resolutions and any other pertinent information posted on the County website.

Mr. Urkov speaks to the next steps of establishing the zone of benefit, the formal arrangement with Sites Authority, true-ups for water amounts, LAFCo/zone map adjustments, budget cash calls vs. financing, and administration of the Zone. He states the intent is to develop policy direction and have the Zone of Benefit begin managing the landowner participation by the end of June 2024.

Ms. Tyler speaks to the formation of the Zone Council who will be using this resource and can manage it to their benefit and whether or not further District administrative assistance will be needed

Mr. King inquires can they self-administer?

Ms. Tyler states the legislation provides that the Zone Council is an elected body much like the landowners' election which gives them the ability to elect their officers and there are certain powers that will be granted to them for their own self-governance, however they are overseen by the Board of Directors of the Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

Ms. Tyler states she feels two seats on the Sites Authority Board is appropriate given the level of participation by the District. Supervisor Evans agrees that it is sufficient and adequate with two seats. The Board concurs two seats are adequate.

Supervisor Corona inquires if the project is 1.5 million acre feet and there is 167,000 acre feet held by participants, is there any potential for that number to grow and will it cause the price to go down? Mr. Urkov states what is being described is the difference between storage and yield. He further states it would be cheaper if there are more acre feet.

Mr. King states he doesn't want to participant in the Zone Benefit and expresses concern that all lands within the District will be made to pay for this project, which only benefits a few. Ms. Tyler responds that only participating landowners will be assessed any charges.

Mr. King inquires who will be responsible for the bonds, and will there be any credit enhancement by the County? Supervisor Evans states the participants will be responsible.

Supervisor Smith inquires if there is an exclusion for landowners outside of the zone to participate? Ms. Tyler states that is correct.

Supervisor Evans states that is why East of the river couldn't be included because they opted out of the District long ago and they are not within the State Water Project place of use.

Mr. King inquires if notices were sent to the areas not included in any water districts (also referred to as white areas")? Supervisor Evans states letters were sent to the Public years back by himself and Supervisor Vann.

Supervisor Boes inquires is there a cap on storage? He further inquires if a participant can also rent the space and do they own the space or storage? Mr. Urkov states you own the water then later the storage.

Supervisor Smith inquires who has recreational rights? Supervisor Evans responds the JPA.

Supervisor Bell inquires who will contact the landowners for the area effected by the inundation? Mr. Urkov responds that the Sites Project Authority is responsible for that portion of the project.

Supervisor Bells inquires where is the money coming from to pay these landowners for their property? Mr. Urkov states it comes from the Sites Project Authority.

Ms. Tyler states five seats on Zone Council seems to be an appropriate number looking at the participants. Mr. Urkov states we envision the Zone Council membership being comprised of individuals whose land holdings lie primarily within an existing home water district. However, making that determination is difficult due to the convoluted land ownerships.

As to collateralization of a landowner's participation, Ms. Tyler states there have been and will continue to be talks with the participants and advisors and it appears that, some people will pay upfront with cash, but others will utilize the financing model. We are seeking direction as to how the Board wants to collaterize the financing through the agreement. Do you want the collateral to be the land on which water is used or can a landowner put up other parcels of land and improvements?

Supervisor Smith inquires as to what else has been used in similar projects? Ms. Tyler states she is unaware of any other contract that is similar or can be used as an example.

As to costs incurred to date by the District in working on the establishment of the Zone of Benefit, Ms. Tyler states the budget development does not include a recoupment of startup cost by the County and is seeking direction on if there is an expectation these monies would be recovered from the landowner participants.

Supervisor Smith states she would like more time to process the numbers. Supervisor Evans states maybe the first six month should be spread over three years on the payback.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE

Sitting As The Colusa County Flood Control And Water Conservation District

1. It is the consensus of the Directors of the Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District that participation include two seats on the Sites JPA and five seats on the Zone Council, startup cost recoupment spread over multiple years and collaterization can be anything land and/or improvements (whether it is in or out of the County) as long as the value meets or exceeds the amount of financing.

Chair Evans adjourned the meeting at 3:33 p.m. to reconvene in Regular Session on January 16, 2024 at the hour of 9:00 a.m.
