- 1. Name of Program: Superior Regional Partnership - OSHPD WET GRANT
- Term of Program: This is a 48-month contract, beginning July 1, 2021 and terminating on June II. 30, 2025, with the option for early termination or extension as provided below.

III. **Program Objective and Overview:**

Objective: The 2020-2025 Workforce Education and Training (WET) program aims to address the shortage of mental health practitioners in the public mental health system (PMHS) through a framework that engages Regional Partnerships and supports individuals through five potential categories including: Pipeline Development, Loan Repayment Program, Undergraduate College and University Scholarships, Clinical Master and Doctoral Graduate Education Stipends, and Retention Activities.

Overview: As outlined in the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development ("OSPHD") 5-year WET Plan, California is separated into five different regions with each region designating its local priorities within the five categories.

The Superior Region - consisting of Butte, Colusa, Del Norte, Glenn, Humboldt, Lake, Lassen, Mendocino, Modoc, Nevada, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Tehama, and Trinity County selected four categories as their local priorities: Loan Repayment, Educational Stipend, Peer Scholarship, and Retention Activities. The Superior Region has partnered with CalMHSA to administer three of these categories:

1. Loan Repayment

Eligible individuals include those who have obtained masters level or doctorate level degrees, or mental health professionals and administrative staff selected by individual counties as working in hard-to-fill or hard-to-retain positions. The definition of hard-to-fill or hard-toretain positions will be identified by each individual county. Recipients would receive the first half of the funds after they complete a 12-month service obligation, and the second half of the funds after they complete a second 12-month service obligation. For recipients who are existing employees and have been employed for a minimum of 12 months upon application, the first half of the funds will be awarded upfront upon award, in exchange for a 12-month service obligation, and the second half of the funds will be awarded after the completion of the initial 12 month service obligation, in exchange for a further 12-month service obligation. Recipients will be able to apply for the award more than once.

2. Educational Stipend

Eligible students are those who participate in traditional, full-time face-to-face programs and those enrolled in part-time distributed learning programs will be eligible for educational stipends. Eligible individuals include those who have obtained masters level or doctorate level degrees, or mental health professionals and administrative staff selected by individual counties as working in hard-to-fill or hard-to-retain positions. In exchange for this stipend,

individuals would agree to work in a PMHS setting in the Superior Region for the equivalent of one year of full-time service in an approved position, regardless of number of years of stipend participation. This can be completed through full-time or part-time employment or, if approved by the agency and the school, through volunteer work. For all stipends, if the employment requirement is not fulfilled within a four-year period, then monetary payback will be required.

3. Peer Scholarship

Career development activities can include travel costs, registration to conferences, or specialized training costs. The SRP supports efforts to implement a statewide peer certification, which has yet to be established. The scholarship may be applied to costs related to statewide peer certification once it has been established. The scholarship may also be applied to areas related to pursing a higher education degree. In exchange for the Peer Specialist scholarships individuals would agree to work in a PMHS setting for the equivalent of one year of half-time service, in an approved position.

 - Confirm matching funds and provide Superior Regional Lead, Butte County, and 5. HCAI with copies of all PAs, invoices, and required financial statements.
 - Collect and hold OSHPD WET Grant Awards, as received from Superior Regional 6. Lead, Butte County.
 - Manage awards for Loan Repayment, Educational Stipends and Peer Scholarships 7. for contributing counties:
 - a. Assist counties in developing expanded eligibility criteria by January 1, 2022.
 - b. Review and score applications according to eligibility and scoring criteria.
 - c. Communicate with applicants about award decisions and next steps.
 - d. Assist counties in developing terms of agreement, including failure to meet/complete terms, by January 1, 2022.
 - e. Assist counties in developing loan repayment verification statements by January 1, 2022.
 - f. Provide support and follow up with awardees:

- i. Obtain proof of eligibility by contacting the awardee's supervisor and confirming hours and employment.
- ii. Confirm employment and adherence to the stipulations of the award on a quarterly basis within (30) days of the quarter end.

8. Disbursement of funds to awardees

- a. Disburse loans, stipends, and scholarships directly to awardees or institutions/ foundations.
- b. Ensure funds are disbursed only to awardees who have successfully completed their service obligations to the project. If it is determined that an awardee does not meet the service obligations outlined in the agreement between CalMHSA and the awardee, CalMHSA will cancel the award contract and inform the awardee of the decision, not distributing payment to the awardee.
- c. If funds have been provided to an awardee and there is a later determination that the awardee has not met all obligations, CalMHSA will work to recoup all costs from the awardee, which may include sending the recoupment to a collections agency. CalMHSA cannot guarantee all funds will be recouped.
- 9. Manage and disburse funds received consistent with the requirements of any applicable laws, regulations, guidelines and/or contractual obligations.
- 10. Provide quarterly reports to participating counties to assist participating counties in their Annual Report process.
- 11. Provide regular fiscal reports to Participant and/or other public agencies with a right to such reports.
- 12. Oversee the distribution and program management of funds, both match funds and OSHPD WET Grant Awards, to the Superior Region Partnership Counties.
- 13. Comply with CalMHSA's Joint Powers Agreement and Bylaws.

B. Responsibilities of Participant:

- 1. Transfer of full county match funds for the Program as specified in section V Fiscal Provisions, which Participant will pay upon execution of this agreement.
- 2. Provide CalMHSA and any other parties deemed necessary with requested information and assistance to fulfill the purpose of the Program.

IV. Withdrawal, Cancellation, and Termination

- Participant may withdraw from the Program and terminate the Participation Agreement A. upon six (6) months' written notice. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing.
- The withdrawal of a Participant from the Program shall not automatically terminate its В. responsibility for its share of the expense and liabilities of the Program. The contributions of current and past Participants are chargeable for their respective share of unavoidable expenses and liabilities arising during the period of their participation.
- Upon cancellation, termination, or other conclusion of the Program, any funds remaining C. undisbursed after CalMHSA satisfies all obligations arising from the administration of the Program shall be returned to Participant. Unused funds paid for a joint effort will be returned pro rata to Participant in proportion to payments made. Adjustments may be made if disproportionate benefit was conveyed on particular Participant. Excess funds at the conclusion of county-specific efforts will be returned to the particular County that paid them.

 - Confirm match funds and provide Lead County and HCAI with copies of all PAs, invoices, and required financial statements.



- 6. Collect and hold HCAI WET Grant Award funds for loan repayment, stipends and scholarships, as received from Lead County, until such time as they are disbursed to awardees.
- Manage awards for loan repayments, stipends and scholarships for contributing counties:
 - a. Assist counties in developing expanded eligibility criteria.
 - Assist counties in developing terms of agreement, including failure to meet/complete terms.
 - c. Assist counties in developing loan repayment verification statements.
 - d. Provide support and follow up with awardees:
 - Obtain proof of eligibility by contacting the awardee's supervisor and confirming hours and employment.
 - ii. Confirm employment and adherence to the stipulations of the award on a quarterly basis within (30) days of the quarter end.
- 8. Disbursement of funds to awardees
 - a. Disburse funds allocated to loan repayment, stipends, and scholarships directly to awardees or institutions/ foundations.
 - b. Ensure funds are disbursed only to awardees who have successfully completed their service obligations to the project. If it is determined that an awardee does not meet the service obligations outlined in the agreement between CalMHSA and the awardee, CalMHSA will cancel the award contract and inform the awardee of the decision, not distributing payment to the awardee.
 - c. If funds have been provided to an awardee and there is a later determination that the awardee has not met all obligations, CalMHSA will work to recoup all costs from the awardee, which may include sending the recoupment to a collections agency. CalMHSA cannot guarantee all funds will be recouped.
- 9. Manage and disburse funds received consistent with the requirements of any applicable laws, regulations, guidelines and/or contractual obligations.
- 10. Provide quarterly reports to participating counties to assist participating counties in their Annual Report process.
- 11. Provide regular fiscal reports to Participant and/or other public agencies with a right to such reports.
- 12. Oversee loan repayment, stipends and scholarships fund distribution and management to include both match funds and HCAI WET Grant Awards, to the Superior Region Partnership Counties.
- 13. Comply with CalMHSA's Joint Powers Agreement and Bylaws.



B. Responsibilities of Participant:

- 1. Transfer of full county match funds for the Program as specified in section V Fiscal Provisions, which Participant will pay upon execution of this agreement.
- 2. Provide CalMHSA and any other parties deemed necessary with requested information and assistance to fulfill the purpose of the Program.
- 3. Provide feedback on Program performance.
- 4. Comply with applicable laws, regulations, guidelines, contractual agreements, JPAs, and bylaws.

III. Duration, Term, and Amendment

- A. The term of the Program is for forty-eight months.
- B. This agreement may be supplemented, amended, or modified only by the mutual agreement of CalMHSA and the Participant, expressed in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.


IV. Withdrawal, Cancellation, and Termination

- A. Participant may withdraw from the Program and terminate the Participation Agreement upon six (6) months' written notice. Notice shall be deemed served on the date of mailing.
- B. The withdrawal of a Participant from the Program shall not automatically terminate its responsibility for its share of the expense and liabilities of the Program. The contributions of current and past Participants are chargeable for their respective share of unavoidable expenses and liabilities arising during the period of their participation.
- C. Upon cancellation, termination, or other conclusion of the Program, any funds remaining undisbursed after CalMHSA satisfies all obligations arising from the administration of the Program shall be returned to Participant. Unused funds paid for a joint effort will be returned pro rata to Participant in proportion to payments made. Adjustments may be made if disproportionate benefit was conveyed on particular Participant. Excess funds at the conclusion of county-specific efforts will be returned to the particular County that paid them.

V. Fiscal Provisions

A. Total County Match Funds

- 1. Participant's total County Match Fund requirement under the 2020-2025 WET Program is \$46,425.22.
- 2. Participant's total County Match Fund requirement, listed in the paragraph above, is comprised of the following funds:



- a. County Match Funds to be collected from Participant in the amount of \$33,773.24.
 - i. Funding required from Participant will not exceed the County Match Funds of \$33,773.24 collected under this agreement. The County Match Funds are due by Participant upon execution of this agreement.
 - NOTE: The portion of the County Match Funds collected allocated for Retention Activities in the amount of \$6,099.55 shall be administered by CIBHS.

and;

- b. Participant's share of Superior Region Carryover Funds in the amount of \$12,651.98.
 - Participant's share of Superior Region Carryover funds will not be collected directly from Participant.

B. County Share of HCAI Grant Award

- County share of HCAI Grant Award in the amount of \$99,404.17 shall be administered by CalMHSA under the terms of the MOU Amendment fully executed on June 3, 2022, between Lead County and CalMHSA.
- NOTE. Under HCAI Grant Agreement No. 20-10019 executed between HCAI and Lead County, the HCAI Grant Award shall be transferred to the Lead County, as outlined under Section E.1, Invoicing and Payment:
 - a. 85% of Participant's share of HCAI Grant Award upon completion of deliverables outlined under Section E.1 of the HCAI Grant Agreement.
 - b. 15% of Participant's share of HCAI Regional Grant Award upon collection and verification of Region Match Funds, on or before July 31, 2024.
- C. <u>Total County Funding</u> administered by CalMHSA in the amount of \$145,829.39 is inclusive of a CalMHSA Administrative Fee of \$18,571.82.
- D. In a Multi-County Program, Participants will share the costs of planning, administration, and evaluation in the same proportions as their overall contributions, which are included in the amount stated in Exhibit C, County Specific Funding.

VI. Limitation of Liability and Indemnification

- A. CalMHSA is responsible only for funds as instructed and authorized by participants. CalMHSA is not liable for damages beyond the amount of any funds which are identified on the cover page of this Agreement, without authorization or contrary to Participant's instructions.
- B. CalMHSA is not undertaking responsibility for assessments, creation of case or treatment plans, providing or arranging services, and/or selecting, contracting with, or supervising

providers (collectively, "mental health services"). Participant will defend and indemnify CalMHSA for any claim, demand, disallowance, suit, or damages arising from Participant's acts or omissions in connection with the provision of mental health services.

This Contract for the billing of behavioral health services ("Contract") is between the County of Colusa ("County"), a political subdivision of the State of California and the Cachil Dehe Band of Wintun Indians of the Colusa Indian Community ("Tribe"), a federally recognized Indian Tribe.

- 1. Services to be Performed: County agrees to provide behavioral health services to the Tribe at no cost to its members. Services to be provided include: substance use disorder treatments, assessments, psychotherapy, medication evaluation and management, and educational group services. The Tribe has agreed to reimburse the County 100% of the costs of services provided by County to its members.
- 2. Term: This Contract shall begin on December 1, 2024 and shall continue through June 30, 2027.
- **3.** Compensation: Tribe will reimburse the County 100% of the costs of services provided. Service rates will be based on the approved Medi-Cal rates set by the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). Compensation will be paid in accordance with paragraph 4, Method of Payment. Except for reimbursement for services provided to tribal members, no other compensation shall be provided to County. The Tribe will receive no compensation from County
- **4. Method of Payment:** The County will provide Tribe with a quarterly invoice for the services provided. Within 30 days of receiving the invoice, Tribe will pay the County for the services provided.
- 5. Indemnity and Liability: Each party shall indemnify, defend, and hold the other party and its directors, officers, employees, and agents harmless against any claims of any kind, arising or alleged to arise out of the willful misconduct, negligent acts, omissions, or violations of law by the party.
- 6. Controlling Law Venue: This Contract is made in the County of Colusa, State of California. The parties specifically agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the Superior Court of California for the County of Colusa.
- 7. Written Notification: Any notice, demand, request, consent, approval, or communication that either party desires or is required to give to the other party shall be in writing and either served personally or sent prepaid, first class mail. Any such notice, demand, etc., shall be addressed to the other party at the address set forth below. Either party may change its address by notifying the other party of the change of address. Notice shall be deemed communicated within 48 hours from the time of mailing if mailed as provided in this section.

- P. The successful vendor shall be required to enter into a contract with the County of Colusa for the services to be provided. Such contract shall incorporate the specifications of the RFB. (*A draft copy is attached*)
- Q. Any Change Orders or issues that may arise must be discussed with the Maintenance Supervisor for prior approval of the best course of action.
- 8. <u>Guarantees:</u> The successful vendor shall guarantee all services provided and shall require each Subcontractor to guarantee their own work, against defective material or faulty workmanship for a minimum of one year after the date of Notice of Completion is issued. 

This public works construction contract ("Contract") is between the County of Colusa ("County"), a political subdivision of the State of California and ______ ("Contractor"), a California Corporation. This is a public works contract subject to Department of Industrial Relations registration, and payment of prevailing wage.

- 1. Services to be Performed: Contractor agrees at its own expense to furnish all equipment, labor and materials necessary to provide County with construction services for asphalt project located at 929 Bridge Street, Colusa, California as more specifically detailed in Attachment "A." Additionally, all terms and conditions of the Request for Bids (RFB) and all documents submitted in response to the RFB are incorporated into the terms and conditions of this contract.
- **2. Term:** All work under this contract shall be completed no later than 120 days from full execution of this contract.
- **3. Compensation:** County will pay Contractor compensation not to exceed \$_______, as provided for in Attachment "B." Compensation will be paid in accordance with paragraph 4, Method of Payment.
 - **A. Retention for Contracts that Exceed \$5,000:** Pursuant to California Public Contract Code section 9203(a), for public works contracts that exceed \$5,000, an amount of 5% shall be withheld from the invoices submitted by the Contractor as retention money to be utilized in case of default or defective materials, equipment, supplies, work or service not rectified by the Contractor. The retention money shall be paid over to the Contractor upon the receipt of a Certificate of Completion.
- **4. Method of Payment:** At the conclusion of the job, Contractor shall provide County with an invoice for the services and lump sum bid. Upon receipt of an invoice, County shall process payment to Contractor as provided for by County's established policies and procedures, and payment will be issued accordingly for undisputed invoices.

A. Invoices shall:

- 1) Be prepared on Contractor's letterhead.
- 2) Bear Contractor's name as shown on the contract.
- 3) Bear the contract number.
- 4) Itemize the costs incurred.
- 5) Include a summary of the services provided.
- 6) Be signed by an authorized official, employee, or agent certifying that the claim represents actual expenses for the services performed under this Contract.
- **5. Professional Ability of Contractor and Standards of Performance:** Contractor represents that it is qualified and licensed to perform the services to be done as required in

this Contract. County relies upon the representations of Contractor regarding professional training, licensing, and ability to perform the services as a material inducement to enter into this Contract.

- **A.** Services shall be provided by Contractor without the advice, control or supervision of County. Contractor shall have sole discretion and control of Contractor's services and the manner in which they are performed.
- **B.** Acceptance of work or payment of invoice by County does not operate to release Contractor from any responsibility to perform work to professional standards.
- **C.** Contractor shall provide properly skilled professional and technical personnel to perform all services under this Contract.
- **6.** Contractor's Books and Records: Contractor shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for services, or expenditures and disbursements charged to County for a minimum period of 5 years, or for any longer period required by law, following audit, or from the date of final payment to Contractor under this Contract, whichever is later.
 - **A.** Contractor shall maintain all documents and records which demonstrate performance under this Contract for a minimum period of 5 years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of termination or completion of this Contract.
 - **B.** Any records or documents required to be maintained pursuant to this Contract shall be made available for inspection or audit at any time during regular business hours, upon written request by County Counsel or other designated representative of County. Copies of such documents shall be provided to County for inspection at the office of the requesting county officer unless it is impractical to do so; in which case the records shall be made available at Contractor's address indicated for receipt of notices in this Contract.
 - C. Where County has reason to believe that such records or documents may be lost or discarded due to dissolution, disbandment, or termination of Contractor's business, County may, on written request, require that custody of the records be given to County and that the records and documents be maintained by County at the Board of Supervisors offices. Access to such records and documents shall be granted to any party authorized by Contractor, Contractor's representatives, or Contractor's successor-in-interest.
- 7. Independent Contractor: Contractor is an independent contractor, not an employee of County. Nothing contained in this Contract, or any document executed in connection with this Contract, shall be construed to create an employer-employee, partnership or joint venture relationship between County and Contractor nor to allow County to exercise discretion or control over the manner in which Contractor performs the work or services

that are the subject matter of this Contract; provided, however, the work or services to be provided by Contractor shall be provided in a manner consistent with reaching County's objectives in entering this Contract.

- **8. Indemnity and Liability:** Each party shall indemnify, defend, and hold the other party and its directors, officers, employees, and agents harmless against any claims of any kind, arising or alleged to arise out of the willful misconduct, negligent acts, omissions, or violations of law by the party.
- **9. Insurance:** Contractor, at its own cost, agrees to maintain, for the duration of this Contract, the following insurance policies with insurers possessing a Best's rating of no less than A:VII:
 - A. Workers' Compensation Coverage: Contractor shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance for its employees in accordance with the laws of the State of California. In addition, Contractor shall require each subcontractor to similarly maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of California for all of the subcontractors' employees. Any notice of cancellation or non-renewal of all Workers' Compensation policies must be received by County at least 30 days prior to such change.
 - **B.** General Liability Coverage: Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage. If a commercial general liability insurance form or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to the work to be performed under this Contract or the general aggregate limit shall be at least twice the required occurrence limit.
 - C. Automobile Liability Coverage: Contractor shall maintain automobile liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage for all activities of the contractor arising out of or in connection with the work to be performed under this Contract, including coverage for owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles, in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for each accident for bodily injury or property damage.
 - **D. Policy Endorsements:** All insurance, except workers' compensation, shall include an endorsement or an amendment to the policy of insurance:
 - 1) Naming County, its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional named insureds with respect to liability arising out of any and all work performed by or on behalf of the Contractor under this Contract:
 - 2) Providing that Contractor's insurance shall be the primary insurance as

respects County, its elected or appointed officers, officials, employees, agents and volunteers. Any insurance maintained by County, including any self-insured retention County may have, shall not be called upon to contribute to a loss covered by Contractor's insurance;

- 3) Providing the policy of insurance shall act for each insured and additional insureds as though a separate policy had been written for each, except with respect to the limits of liability of the insuring company;
- 4) Providing that the insurer waives all rights of subrogation against County, its elected or appointed officers, officials, employees, agents or volunteers;
- 5) Providing any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policy of insurance shall not affect coverage provided to County, its elected or appointed officers, officials, employees agents, or volunteers;
- 6) Providing broad-form contractual liability coverage insuring contractor's indemnity obligations under this contract; and
- 7) Providing that coverage under the policy shall not be suspended, voided, reduced or cancelled in coverage or in limits without 30 days written notice certain to County.
- **E. Deductibles and Self-insured Retentions:** Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by County before work begins. At County's option, Contractor shall demonstrate financial capability for payment of such deductibles or self-insured retentions.
- **F. Proof of Coverage:** At the time of execution of this contract, Contractor shall furnish County with copies of its insurance policies and endorsements affecting coverage required by this Contract.

10. Guarantees **OPTIONAL**

- A. The Contractor shall guarantee all services provided in fulfillment of paragraph 1 above, and shall require each Subcontractor to guarantee their own work, against defective material or faulty workmanship for a minimum of one year after the date of Notice of Completion is issued. In addition, all standard manufacturer warranties shall be passed to the County which may extend the warranty period beyond one year.
- **B.** The County retains all rights and remedies provided by law including those pertaining to latent defects.
- **C.** If repairs are required in connection with guaranteed work, the Contractor shall promptly upon receipt of notice from the County, and without expense to the County:
 - 1) Place in satisfactory condition in every detail all of such guaranteed work.
 - 2) Make good all damage to the building, site, equipment, furniture, or

contents which, in the opinion of the County, is the result of work not in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents or disturbed in the process of correcting guaranteed work.

- **D.** If the Contractor disturbs any work guaranteed under another contract in fulfilling the requirements herein they shall restore such disturbed work to a condition satisfactory to the County and guarantee such restored work to the same extent as it was guaranteed under such other contract.
- **E.** A new full-term guarantee period shall apply to repaired work upon completion of repairs.
- **F.** If Contractor fails to proceed to comply with the terms of the guarantee or make repairs of defective work within 7 days of Notice from County, the County may remedy the Contractor's failure by whatever means the County deems expedient. The County may, at any time, take measures to mitigate damage or reduce undesirable effects of defective work. All costs expended by County pursuant to this Section shall be paid by Contractor.

11. Liquidated Damages

- A. The parties agree that should the work not be complete, as acknowledged with an executed Notice of Completion within the Term as specified in paragraph 2 above, damages will be sustained by the County. It is understood and agreed that it is or may be impracticable or extremely difficult to determine the actual amount of damages the County will sustain in the event of and by reason of such delay in completing the work; and it is therefore agreed that the Contractor will pay the County \$250 per day for the County's liquidated damages. In the event the Contractor fails to make such payment, the County may deduct the amount thereof from any money due or that may become due the Contractor under the Contract and should the balance due not be sufficient to cover the amount owed, the County shall have the right to recover the balance from the Contractor, from other contracts between Contractor and County, or from the Contractor's sureties or any other means as allowed by law.
- **12. Performance Standards:** Contractor shall use the standard of care in its profession and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, codes, ordinances and regulations.
- **13. Department of Industrial Relations Registration:** Contractors and subcontractors shall register with the California Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) pursuant to California Labor Code sections 1771.1 and 1725.5. Contractors and any subcontractors shall supply County with a copy of proof of registration at the time of execution of this Contract.
- 14. Prevailing Wage: This Contract is subject to prevailing wage rates. Copies of the prevailing rates or per diem wages applicable to this Project are available from the California Department of Labor Statistics and Research at www.dir.ca.gov/dlsr/PWD/index.htm or 455 Golden Gate Avenue, 9th Floor, San Francisco, California 94102 (415) 703-4780. Contractor is required to post a copy of the wage rates on the job site. Any employee whose type of work is not covered by any of the classified wage rates shall be paid not less than the rate of wage listed for the classification

which most nearly corresponds to the type of work to be performed. Pursuant to California Labor Code section 1775, Contractor, and any subcontractor, shall forfeit up to \$200.00 per calendar day, or portion of a day, for each worker paid less than the prevailing rates for such work or craft, and the penalty shall be imposed and distributed pursuant to Section 1775.

- **15. Payment Bond:** Pursuant to Chapter 5, of Title 3, of Part 6, of Division 4 of the California Civil Code, if the Contract compensation exceeds \$25,000, Contractor shall, before commencement of any work, provide County with a payment bond equal to 100% of the compensation payable in accordance with this Contract to secure the Contractor's, and any subcontractor's, performance and provide coverage for the services to be provided pursuant to this Contract by Contractor and any subcontractor.
- **16. Payroll Records:** Contractor and all subcontractors shall keep accurate payroll records as required by California Labor Code section 1776.
 - **A.** Upon written request by County, Contractor and all subcontractors shall, within ten (10) calendar days, provide County with a certified copy of all payroll records kept pursuant to Section 1776.
 - **B.** Pursuant to Section 1776(h), Contractor and all subcontractors will be assessed a penalty of \$100.00 for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each worker if a certified copy of the records subject to Section 1776 are not made available as required by section 15 A of this Contract.
 - **C.** Contractors and any subcontractors shall furnish electronic payroll records to the California Labor Commissioner in accordance with California Labor Code section 1771.4.
- 17. Licenses: Contractor represents and warrants to County that it has all licenses, permits, qualifications, insurance, and approvals of whatsoever nature which are legally required of Contractor to practice its trade and/or profession. Contractor represents and warrants to County that Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, keep in effect or obtain at all times during the term of this Contract, any licenses, permits, insurance, and approvals which are legally required of Contractor to practice its trade and/or profession.
- **18. Controlling Law Venue**: This Contract is made in the County of Colusa, State of California. The parties specifically agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the Superior Court of California for the County of Colusa.
- 19. Written Notification: Any notice, demand, request, consent, approval, or communication that either party desires or is required to give to the other party shall be in writing and either served personally or sent prepaid, first class mail. Any such notice, demand, etc., shall be addressed to the other party at the address set forth below. Either party may change its address by notifying the other party of the change of address. Notice shall be deemed communicated within 48 hours from the time of mailing if mailed as provided in this

section.

- **20. Entire Contract**: This Contract constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of contract between County and Contractor. All prior written and oral communications, including **correspondence**, drafts, memoranda, and representations, are superseded in total by this Contract.
- **21. Amendments**: This Contract may be modified or amended only by a written document executed by both Contractor and County and approved as to form by the County Counsel.
- **22. Waiver**: No failure on the part of either party to exercise any right or remedy provided for by this Contract shall operate as a waiver of any other right or remedy that party may have.
- **23. Execution**: This Contract may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall constitute one and the same instrument and shall become binding upon the parties.
- **24. Assignment & Subcontracting**: The parties recognize that a substantial inducement to County for entering into this Contract is the professional reputation, experience, and competence of Contractor. Assignments of any or all rights, duties or obligations of Contractor under this Contract will be permitted only with the express consent of County. Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of the work to be performed under this Contract without the written authorization of County. If County consents to such subcontract, Contractor shall be fully responsible to County for all acts or omissions of the subcontractor. Nothing in this Contract shall create any contractual relationship between County and subcontractor nor shall it create any obligation on the part of County to pay any monies due to any such subcontractor unless otherwise required by law.
- **25. Termination**: This Contract may be terminated for the following reasons:
 - **A.** Immediately for cause if either party violates any of the terms or provisions of this Contract: or
 - **B.** By County without cause upon 15 days written notice of termination.
- **26. Partial Invalidity**. If any provision of this Contract is held to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provision and/or provisions shall remain in full force

and effect and shall not be affected or invalidated.

Adopt a Resolution Amending the Colusa County Groundwater Commission's By-Laws to allow a Supervisor to nominate an individual with agricultural operations within their district to represent said district on the Groundwater Commission.

Detailed Description/Background of request

The bylaws for the Colusa County Groundwater Commission details the required qualifications to serve on the Groundwater Commission as well as the selection process.

The requirements for the Commission include:

- 1. Must be a resident of Colusa County.
- 2. Must be an agricultural groundwater user (may also utilize surface water).
- 3. Must have knowledge of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA).
- 4. Must be able to commit to regularly attending meetings of the Groundwater Commission.
- 5. Must be willing and capable to serve as a liaison to other groundwater users to share information.

In terms of the selection process, each Supervisor nominates a resident within their district that meets the above qualifications to serve on the Commission and that nomination is then confirmed by a majority vote of the Board of Supervisors. At issue is that it has proven to be difficult at times to find an individual that meets not only the required qualifications but also the residency requirement for the Supervisorial District. For example, despite repeated efforts over several years to find a Commission

representative for District 4, a qualified resident was not found. Compounding this issue, if a Commission member moves out of the District for which they were selected to represent, they are no longer eligible to represent that District.

The proposed bylaw amendment would add the option for a Supervisor to nominate a Commission representative if that candidate has agricultural operations within their District. Per the terms of the bylaws, an amendment can be initiated by the Commission itself, or by the Board of Supervisors. All other qualifications and requirements (such as being a County resident) would remain. Below is the specific change that is being submitted for the Board's consideration. This change is also included in Exhibit "A.1" which is a red-lined version of the bylaws showing the change.

III. Each member will represent an individual Supervisorial district and be a resident of or have agricultural operations within that district.

The intent of this change is to provide the Board members with some added flexibility in nominating an individual to the full Board for consideration.

Prior Board Action

The Colusa County Groundwater Commission was established by Ordinance Number 615 and formally created by the Board of Supervisors adopting Resolution 98-44 on August 24, 1998.

The current by-laws were approved by the Board on May 16, 2017 pursuant to Board Resolution No. 17-2024.

WHEREAS, on May 16, 2017 the Colusa County Board of Supervisors approved the current Colusa County Groundwater Commission Rules and Bylaws pursuant to Board Resolution No. 17-024;

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Rules and Bylaws, each Board of Supervisor member nominates a Groundwater Commission member to represent their District who meets the stipulated qualifications and who is also a resident of said Supervisor's district to the full Board for consideration and confirmation; and

EXHIBIT "A" RULES AND BYLAWS OF THE COLUSA COUNTY GROUNDWATER COMMISSION As Amended January 28, 2025

PURPOSE

The purpose of these Bylaws is to prescribe the terms and conditions by which the business and affairs of the Colusa County Groundwater Commission shall be managed.

POWERS AND DUTIES

- I. The Colusa County Groundwater Commission is intended to function on a countywide basis serving the following purposes:
 - Responsible stewardship of the water resources in Colusa County;
 - Increasing understanding regarding the groundwater basins underlying Colusa County;
 - Retaining local control of water management decisions;
 - Ensuring all legislative requirements are met; and
 - Represent individual well pumpers on the Colusa Groundwater Authority Board.
- II. The Colusa County Groundwater Commission shall operate as a standing committee of the Colusa County Board of Supervisors and shall operate in accordance with the open meeting laws of the State of California, the Ralph M. Brown Act (Government Code section 54950 et.seq.).
- III. The role of the Groundwater Commission shall be:
 - To serve as a forum for presenting and discussing groundwater information for the general public
 - To receive and address groundwater concerns and issues
 - To protect County water supply sources and interests, and the water quality
 - To promote responsible stewardship of the water resources in Colusa County
 - To increase understanding of the groundwater basins underlying Colusa County
 - To retain local control of water management decisions
 - To ensure all legislative requirements are met
 - To process out-of-county water transfers; and
 - To provide input to the Groundwater Sustainability Agency.

NUMBER OF COMMISSIONERS

- I. The Commission shall be composed of five (5) members.
- II. Each member shall be a resident of the County of Colusa.
- III Each member will represent an individual Supervisorial district and be a resident of or have agricultural operations within that district.
- IV. Each member of the Commission shall be nominated by the County Supervisor representing their district, and appointed by a majority vote of the Board of Supervisors.

REQUIREMENTS OF COMMISSIONERS

- 1. Must be a resident of Colusa County.
- 2. Must be an agricultural groundwater user (may also utilize surface water).
- 3. Must have knowledge of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA).
- 4. Must be able to commit to regularly attending meetings of the Groundwater Commission.
- 5. Must be willing and capable to serve as a liaison to other groundwater users to share information.

TERMS OF OFFICE

- I. The Commission will be comprised of five (5) members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each Supervisor shall nominate one member to the Board Chair for ratification by a majority vote of the Board. The term shall coincide with the term of his/her Supervisor which the member represents at the time of appointment. Reelection of the Supervisor of that district shall not constitute automatic reappointment of the Commission member and shall require a majority vote of the Board.
- II. Any member may apply to the Board of Supervisors for reappointment at the end of his/her term.
- III. Commission members will serve voluntarily without compensation or reimbursement.

REMOVAL OF COMMISSIONERS

- I. All Commissioners shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors.
- II. Members of the Commission may be removed by the Board of Supervisors in its discretion at any time for any reason without cause.
- III. Attendance of Commissioners at meetings of the Commission are essential to the success of the Commission, a Commissioner who fails to attend two (2) regularly scheduled meetings during the fiscal year will have his/her name directed to the Board of Supervisors which may terminate the Commissioner's appointment; thereby creating a vacancy on the Commission. In such an instance the Commission may recommend a replacement to the Board of Supervisors.

FILLING VACANCIES

- I. Vacancies on the Commission shall be filled by appointment of the Board of Supervisors.
- II. An Appointee shall serve the unexpired term of the Commissioner vacating the position assumed by the Appointee.

OFFICERS

- I. Officers of the Commission shall consist of a Chair and Vice Chair, who shall be elected by the Commission members. The Secretary/Clerk shall be the Director of the County's development services department or his/her assigned representative. .
- II. Nomination and election of officers shall be held at the first meeting following the adoption of these Bylaws and thereafter in January of each year; and may be held at other times as vacancies occur after giving members fourteen (14) day notice.
- III. The Chair and Vice Chair shall take office immediately after election.
- IV. Duties of officers shall be as follows:
 - A. Chair shall preside over all meetings of the Commission and appoint special committees, the Chairs of those committees and set the duration and tasks of those committees as special advisory needs of the Commission may arise and require such support.

- C. Secretary/Clerk shall keep and attest to records of the proceedings of the Commission.

GROUNDWATER AUTHORITY BOARD REPRESENTATIVES

- I. Two members of the Groundwater Commission, will serve on the Colusa Groundwater Authority Board as private pumper representatives for Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) implementation in the County. These two members will have the following qualifications:
 - A. Must have knowledge and understanding of SGMA legislation.
 - B. Must have background knowledge in the formation of the Colusa Groundwater Authority and the Authority's Joint Powers Agreement.
 - C. Must be able to regularly attend the Authority's Board meetings and be prepared to participate in discussions and decision-making activities.
 - D. Must understand the needs of private pumpers and serve as their representative on the Authority Board
- II. The members of the Commission will nominate any two members to serve on the Authority Board. Upon approval of the nominations by a majority vote of the Commission, the nominations shall be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for ratification.
- III. The Commission by a four-fifths vote may recommend to the Board of Supervisors the removal from the Colusa Groundwater Authority Board of any member representative. The Board of Supervisors may, through the recommendation of the Commission or on its own, remove from the Colusa Groundwater Authority Board any member representative, and replace that representative with another member of the Commission, by a majority vote.
- IV. The term of service on the Colusa Groundwater Authority Board shall coincide with the Commissioner's otherwise normal term and, contingent upon their term on the Commission being extended, shall be extended on the Authority Board.

MEETINGS

- I. Regular meetings of the Commission shall be held quarterly, at a date and time set by the Commission which shall not interfere with the meetings of the Colusa County Board of Supervisors.
- II. The meetings shall be noticed and take place in a public setting in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (Government Code section 54950 et.seq.).
- III. The Colusa County Groundwater Commission shall conduct its meetings and affairs in strict accordance with Board of Supervisors Policy Number 101, "Procedures for the Conduct of Board Meetings," and Board of Supervisor Policy Number 102, "Rules of the Board of Supervisors," with the following exceptions:
 - A. The Director of the County's development services department or his/her assigns shall act in the stead of the Board Clerk.

Detailed Description/Background of request

Under California Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 43205, Colusa County has been designated a solid waste local enforcement agency (LEA). As an LEA, the County, through its Environmental Health Division, is empowered to enforce provisions of the California Public Resources Code regarding solid waste facilities.

Under California PRC §44309, Colusa County as an LEA is required to have a Hearing Panel or Hearing Officer in place to rule on alleged solid waste violations. In February of 2022, the Board adopted Resolution No. 22-006 which established the requirements for LEA Hearing Officers and the procedures for the conduct of hearings (Attachment #1). At that time, Luke Steidlmayer, Esquire was appointed as the County's LEA Hearing Officer.

As with the County's Code Compliance Hearing Officer appointment, Luke Steidlmayer, Esquire is no longer available due his election as a superior court judge; which creates a potential conflict of interest and change in the firm's law practice.

As the Board may recall, in December the Board appointed three local attorney's to perform the Code Compliance Administrative Hearing Officer's functions on an asneeded basis. The County Counsel's office has contacted the three attorneys and all are eligible and willing to perform the LEA Hearing Officer services. Staff believes that the use of three different attorneys will ensure that there is always at least one attorney available should there be a time or other conflict to preside over a particular case. Pursuant to the adopted procedures for the appointment of an LEA Hearing Officer, the Board may appoint multiple hearing officers who would serve on a rotational basis

- 1. Charles T. Yerxa, Jr.: Mr. Yerxa has been practicing law since 1987.
- 2. Angeles S. Carrion: Ms. Carrion has been practicing law since 2016.

Prior Board Action

On February 15, 2022, the Board adopted Resolution No. 22-006 repealing the solid waste independent hearing panel, approving qualifications for the LEA hearing officer and the hearing procedures, and appointed Luke Steidlmayer, Esquire as the County's LEA Hearing Officer.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The services of the Hearing Officer would be paid initially from the Environmental Health Division's professional services budget and staff would seek reimbursement for any such cost from the appellant as part of the hearing decision.

RESOLUTION OF THE COLUSA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REPEALING THE SOLID WASTE INDEPENDENT HEARING PANEL, APPROVING QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A HEARING OFFICER FOR LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HEARING ON PETITIONS, APPROVING PROCEDURES FOR CONDUCT OF HEARINGS, AND APPOINTING SAID HEARING OFFICER PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE SECTIONS 44307, 44308, AND 44310,

WHEREAS, California Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 44308 sets forth procedures for designation of a Hearing Officer, PRC §44310 sets forth the procedures for requesting and conducting such hearings;

WHEREAS, on February 11,1992, the Colusa County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 92-09 designating Colusa County Environmental Health as the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) and certified by CalRecycle pursuant to PRC 43200, et. seq. and Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR) 18051 for the permitting, inspection, and enforcement of solid waste handling and disposal sites;

WHEREAS, on December 16, 1992, Colusa County Environmental Health was certified as the designated Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) pursuant to PRC 43200-43222 and Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR) 18051;

WHEREAS, the Colusa County Board of Supervisors subsequently established a Hearing Panel for hearing appeals received by the LEA pursuant to PRC §44307;

WHEREAS, PRC §44308 authorizes the Colusa County Board of Supervisors to appoint a Hearing Officer to hear appeals received by the LEA pursuant to PRC 44307 if it also adopts procedures for making the appointment and adopts qualifications that the Hearing Officer is required to meet;

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2022, the Colusa County Board of Supervisors duly considered the adoption of a Resolution which would replace the formerly established Hearing Panel for hearing appeals received by the LEA pursuant to PRC 44307 with a Hearing Officer; and

WHEREAS, the Colusa County Board of Supervisors has prepared the procedures for appointment of a Hearing Officer and qualifications for a Hearing Officer pursuant to PRC 44308(d).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Colusa County Board of Supervisor's previous action which established the Hearing Panel to hear appeals received by the LEA pursuant to PRC §44307 is hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the attached qualifications (Exhibits "A" and "B") for the appointment of Hearing Officer and the procedures for conduct of hearings pursuant to PRC 44308(d), are hereby adopted.

EXHIBIT "A"

PROCEDURES FOR APPOINTMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS OF HEARING OFFICERS FOR HEARINGS ON PETITIONS RELATED TO LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY PROCEEDINGS

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the California Public Resources Code (PRC) concerning activities of the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA), including but not limited to those provisions set forth in PRC Sections 44308 et seq., the Colusa County Environmental Health Division Manager in consultation with the Community Development Director shall determine, consistent with the requirements set forth below, a proposed Hearing Officer, whose qualifications shall be set forth and presented to the Board of Supervisors for consideration of appointment as Hearing Officer.
- 2. A Hearing Officer shall conduct all proceedings in accordance with the applicable provisions set forth in the Public Resources Code.
- 3. For consideration as a Hearing Officer in the above described role, a person/firm shall meet the requirements of PRC §44308(d) and must not have a conflict of interest and shall be independent of the "operating unit" as defined in 14 CCR 18011.
- 4. For consideration as a Hearing Officer, a person shall demonstrate experience and familiarity with the current law in the State of California concerning solid waste issues.
- 5. For consideration as a Hearing Officer, a person shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Environmental Health Division Manager that the person possesses a judicial demeanor consistent with the impartial conduct of any proceedings.
- 6. The Board of Supervisors shall consider and take action on the recommendation received from the Environmental Health Division Manager. Any such appointment shall be effective until further notice unless terminated earlier by either party with 30-day notice.
- 7. Additional Hearing Officers may be appointed who may serve on a rotational basis.

EXHIBIT "B"

PROCEDURES FOR ADJUDICATORY HEARINGS

Section 1. Application

- (a) The hearing procedures under this Article shall govern all hearings and appeals which the Hearing Officer is authorized or required to conduct pursuant to the California Public Resources Code (PRC). To the extent that the procedures set forth in this Article conflict with the PRC, the PRC shall control.
- (b) Without limiting the generality of subsection (a), hearings conducted before the Hearing Officer shall be in accordance with PRC Section 44310.

Section 2. Scope of Formal Review

The Hearing Officer shall hear and review an appeal of the LEA's administrative determination or a petition alleging the LEA's failure to act in accordance with the laws or regulations specified in PRC Section 44307, taking into account:

- (a) All of the material on which LEA staff based its determination or its decision to not act, including state law and all other applicable laws;
- (b) The reasons given by the appellant or the petitioner for requesting Hearing Officer review;
- (c) Any additional relevant documentary and, testamentary material submitted by the appellant or the petitioner; and
- (d) Any further information which the Hearing Officer in its discretion obtains by request or investigation at the proceedings in order to insure a fair, full and impartial review of the claim.

Section 3. Conduct of the Hearing

Hearings shall not be conducted according to technical rules of evidence, however:

- (a) Oral evidence shall be taken only on oath or affirmation;
- (b) Admissibility of evidence. Any relevant evidence shall be admitted if it is the sort of evidence on which responsible persons are accustomed to rely upon in the conduct of serious affairs, regardless of the existence of any common law or statutory rule which might make improper the admission of such evidence over objection in civil actions in courts of competent jurisdiction in this state;
- (c) Exclusion of evidence. The Hearing Officer has discretion to exclude evidence if its probative value is substantially outweighed by the probability that its admission will necessitate undue consumption of time;
- (d) Hearsay evidence may be used for the purpose of supplementing or explaining other evidence but over timely objection shall not be sufficient in itself to support a finding unless it

would be admissible over objection in civil actions. An objection is timely if made before submission of the case or on reconsideration;

- (e) The rules of privilege shall be effective to the extent that they are otherwise required by statute to be recognized at the hearing;
- (f) All evidence must be part of the record and the Hearing Officer shall not conduct independent investigations or engage in off-the record conversations with witnesses or parties regarding the matter under consideration by the Hearing Officer;
- (g) In reaching a decision official notice may be taken, either before or after submission of the case for decision, of any generally accepted technical or scientific matter related to solid waste, and of any fact which may be judicially noticed by the courts of this State. Parties present at the hearing shall be informed of the matters to be noticed, and those matters shall be noted in the record, referred to therein, or appended thereto. Any such party shall be given a reasonable opportunity on request to refute the officially noticed matters by evidence or by written or oral presentation of authority, the matter of such refutation to be determined by the Hearing Officer,

Section 4. Rights of Parties

Each party shall have the right:

- (a) To call and examine witnesses on any matter relevant to the issues of the hearing;
- (b) To introduce documentary and physical evidence;
- (c) To cross-examine opposing witnesses on any matter relevant to the issues of the hearing even though that matter was not covered in the direct examination. If an appellant does not testify on his or her behalf, he or she may be called and examined as if under cross-examination;
- (d) To impeach any witness regardless of which party first called the witness to testify;
- (e) To introduce rebuttal evidence;
- (f) To be represented by any person who is lawfully permitted to so represent.

Section 5. Subpoenas

- (a) The provisions of Article 11 of Chapter 4.5 of the California Government Code, Section 11450.05 et seq., entitled "Subpoenas," shall apply to the conduct of hearings held by the Hearing Officer;
- (b) Without limiting the generality of subsection a, above, reference is made to the provisions of Government Code Section 11450.20 (a) which states: "Subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum shall be issued by the agency [LEA] or the presiding officer at the request of a party or by the attorney of record for a party, in accordance with the Sections 1985 to 1985.4, inclusive of the Code of Civil Procedure;"
- (c) The Hearing Officer shall be considered the presiding officer for purposes of enforcing the provisions of Government Code Section 11450.05 et seq.

(d) The provisions of Government Code Section 11450.05 et seq. in their current form are set forth in Appendix A.

Section 6. Findings and Order

- (a) Within five (5) days following the conclusion of the hearing, the Hearing Officer shall make written findings of fact, based upon the evidence received at the hearing to support its decision and shall issue an order affirming, modifying, or overruling the determination or order of the LEA under appeal or the subject of the petition;
- (b) The decision of the Hearing Officer shall be final and conclusive pursuant to PRC Section 45017. An appeal may be filed with CalRecycle pursuant to PRC Section 45030 then to the Superior Court pursuant to PRC Section 45040;
- (c) The Secretary shall be charged with the responsibility of providing a copy of the Hearing Officer's decision to the parties. The Secretary shall provide a copy of the decision to the appellant or the petitioner by United States mail or by personal service at the address listed on the appeal or the petition.

Section 7. Record

A record of the entire proceedings before the Hearing Officer shall be made by tape recording or by any other means of permanent recording determined to be appropriate by the Hearing Officer. A copy of the tape or transcript of the proceedings shall be available to all parties upon request and upon prepayment of the County's actual costs, including material and staff time, to reproduce the tape or transcript of the proceedings.

Section 8. Continuances

To the extent permitted under the PRC, the Hearing Officer may grant continuances for good cause shown. All time limits specified herein may be extended upon a showing of good cause.

Section 9. Oaths

The Hearing Officer has the power to administer oaths and affirmations.

Detailed Description/Background of request

California Government Code section 87202 requires certain elected and appointed officials ("Filing Officers") to file statements of economic interest with the County Clerk. In addition to Filing Officers, the County has designated other County employees and officials who are required to file statements of economic interest. These employees and officials, in addition to Filing Officers, are designated in Appendix A to the County's Conflict of Interest Code, Article XVI of Chapter 2.

Since the last review of the Code in 2022, positions have been added or their duties modified that require the COI to be modified. Additionally, there are several other positions that have been determined to no longer be necessary to include for COI purposes. This Ordinance amends Appendix A to reflect those changes.

Prior Board Action

On October 13, 2020 the Board amended Appendix A and B and adopted Ordinance No. 810.

On January 3, 2023 the Board amended Appendix A and adopted Ordinance No. 830. On January 14, 2025 the Board approved the introduction and first reading.

Article XVI. Conflict of Interest Code

2-100 Conflict of interest – Disclosure by employees/officials.

- (a) The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000 et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission (hereinafter "FPPC") has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs., Section 18730) which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. The FPPC terms can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code and as may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act, following public notice and hearing. The Political Reform Act of 1974 requires that agency conflict of interest codes designate the employee positions within that agency "which involve the making or participating in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest" of the designated employee in Government Code Section 87302(a).
- (b) Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs., Section 18730 et seq. and any amendments thereto which become duly adopted by the FPPC are hereby incorporated into this Code by reference. This regulation and Appendix A, designating Colusa County officials and employees required to file FPPC Form 700 Statement of Economic Interest disclosure forms in addition to the mandatory statutory filing employees and officials pursuant to Government Code Section 87200, and Appendix B, establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code for the county of Colusa.
- (c) Designated employees and officials shall file statements of economic interest with the county of Colusa county clerk, by April 1st of each year on the form which can be obtained from the office of the county clerk. The county clerk agency shall make all statements available for public inspection and reproduction pursuant to Government Code Section 81008.
- (d) Upon the hiring of a new employee and as well as upon the termination of employment for every employee whose position is listed in Appendix A, the county payroll department shall advise the office of the county clerk on a form to be provided by the county clerk of the dates of new hire or termination. Based thereon, the office of the county clerk shall provide information to such employees concerning reporting requirements under this Code.
- (e) In the event that the office of the county clerk determines a failure to comply with this reporting requirement has occurred, notice shall be given to the appropriate employee/officer/official. If compliance with the filing does not occur after notice has been given within the time specified in the notice, the county clerk shall report to the board of

supervisors the failure to comply. Thereafter, the county clerk shall levy a fine for any statement that is filed late, in the amount of ten dollars per day up to a maximum of one hundred dollars (see Government Code Section 91013). In addition, the county clerk shall report to the board of supervisors any failure to comply on the part of employees/officials subject to the FPPC enforcement division for investigation and possible prosecution. A fine of up to five thousand dollars per violation may also be imposed (see Government Code Section 83116).

Category 1: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the county, plan to do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the county within the next year, or have done business or owned real property within the jurisdiction of the county within the past two years.

Category 2: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two miles outside, the jurisdiction of the county.

Category 3: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the county, plan to engage in such activities within the jurisdiction of the county within the next year, or have engaged in such activities within the jurisdiction of the county within the past two years.

Category 4: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are banking, savings and loan, or other financial institutions.

Category 5: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the county and when the authorization to purchase, lease, acquire or make recommendations on such goods and services is within the scope of responsibilities of the designated employee or official.

Category 6: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the designated employee's or official's department.

I. STAFF REPORTS

Ms. Costello announces new hours for the library starting in 2025 and thanks all for the help in restructuring the new hours to help better serve the citizens and ensure more equitable service. She distributes the new library hours. (Handout on file in Clerk's office)

Ms. Allen states ag is busy issuing permits, renewing licenses and registrations. She states they had their Continuing Education class and air pollution are busy renewing their burn permits. She further states that they had their annual Fire Chiefs meeting and she announces that Don Kitamura will be retiring after 20 years of service.

Mr. Plucker states the Planning Commission recently approved a use permit to allow Carbon Zero to establish a bio char facility at the Williams Hulling Plant. He further states it will convert almond shells into bio char and that will be returned to

He states most importantly on a yearly basis it will convert 48,000 tons to 16,000 tons of bio char and will cause a 67% reduction in truck traffic and of ag waste while creating new jobs. He states earlier this month the AB1265 owners list was recorded and this will generate \$440,000 in revenue to the County. He announces the new Community Development Director, Xzandrea Fowler.

Mr. Azevedo states he gave a brief explanation on road conditions to the folks in the hallway and thanks his road crew for repairing roads and Glenn-Colusa maintenance who were very responsive addressing needs that folks brought to their attention. He further states last Thursday at an RCRC meeting it was mentioned that the County was successful in procuring a \$76,000 household hazardous waste grant. He states after the first of year there will be a construction manager RFQ issued by the Sites Project to find a qualified firm to assist in continuing design and construction.

Ms. Tyler states the swearing in of new elected officials will be on January 6, 2024 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 1 of the historic courthouse and Judge Farrell will be performing the swearing in ceremony. She further states the December 5, 2024 earthquake caused some damages in historic courthouse, but was mostly cosmetic. She will be working with maintenance to get a repair plan to get those issues fixed. She further states Directors Mr. Plucker, Ms. Flower and Ag Commissioner Ms. Allen met with the RCRC Economic team and will be submitting a grant application under the USDA Rural Development Block Program for a biodiversity zone designation opportunity. She further states if awarded the funding an agreement would be coming to the Board for consideration. Claimant Joshua von Atzigen suffered injuries in the accident which include but are not limited to concussion without loss of consciousness and chipped 4 teeth. Claimant's damages, including but not limited to Property Damage, Medical Expenses, Estimated Future Medical Care, Loss of Earnings and Earning Capacity, Pain & Suffering/General Damages, and all other damages falling within the unlimited jurisdiction of the Superior Court. On July 27, 2024, at approximately 1329, Niklaus von Atzigen was driving Westbound on SR20, 1540 feet east of Walnut Drive in an unincorporated area of Colusa County. In his vehicle were passengers Kimberly von Atzigen, Joshua von Atzigen and Timothy Gray. At the same time, a vehicle driven by Damiano Danny Tamburrino was driving eastbound on SR-20 and crossed into westbound lanes of traffic, striking the von Atzigen vehicle head on.

The complete Traffic Collision Report has not yet been made available to Claimant. Discovery is continuing and Claimant reserves the right to supplement and/or amend this response at a later date.

Respondent created, or permitted to exist, a dangerous condition of public property; and/or its employees negligently and carelessly committed, or omitted, acts, so as to cause injury and damage to Claimants and Claimants' decedent, as follows:

The lighting (or lack thereof) on the involved section of road was so located, constructed, placed, designed, repaired, maintained, used, warned and otherwise defective in design, manufacture and warning that the involved section of road constituted a dangerous condition of public property, in that, among other things, it created an unreasonable and foreseeable risk of injury and harm to users of the road.

The traffic warnings, markings, barriers, medians, and fixtures thereon (or lack thereof) were so located, constructed, placed, designed, repaired, maintained, used, warned and otherwise defective in design, manufacture, timing and warning that the involved section of road constituted a dangerous condition of public property, in that, among other things, it created an unreasonable and foreseeable risk of injury and harm to users of the road.

Claimant further contends that the highway was so contracted, designed, maintained, used, and was otherwise defective in design and warning in that, among other things, was too narrow and failed to meet the minimum requirements for line of sight for the design and speed

limit of the roadway, that it exceeded its design speed for the capacity of the roadway thereby creating an unreasonable and foreseeable risk of injuries to users of the roadway.

Claimant further contends that the highway was excessively narrow, with insufficient shoulders and lanes, that it lacked rumble strips or any other markings or fixtures to prevent head on collisions. Claimant further contends that this area of road was subject to changed physical conditions and increased volume in traffic accidents.
