

THAT'S OVERDUE!



After more than thirty years, the inside of the main branch is going to be given a fresh coat of paint. Initially we considered featuring the pantone color of the year, coral, on all of the walls, but decided in the end a nice soft white would best compliment our shelving and materials.

Between **April 4–15**, a team of professional painters from All Star Painting will converge on the library to work with the county maintenance crew and library staff to remove books and shelves from walls, replace fallen ceiling tiles and paint the interior of the library from top to bottom.

For those ten days, there will not be any programming hosted at the main branch in Colusa. However, the Raising a Reader graduation will take place, as planned in the Morse Conference Room. Families enrolled in the program have been notified. While the book drop will be checked daily, late fees accrued during painting will be waived.

The other six branch locations throughout the county will be open as usual. Story time and programming at the branch locations will continue as scheduled. Additionally, we will have representatives at the Family Fair at Egling Middle School on April 13, providing free books to children and their families. When we reopen on Tuesday, April 16 the library will resume all programming.

While the closure will cause some inconvenience, we hope that in taking the time to care for our building, and investing in our infrastructure we will be better able to accommodate the changing needs of our community, and continue to provide patrons with a safe, clean space where they feel welcomed and fulfilled.



STAFF SPOTLIGHT: GABRIELA SILVA

April 24, 3:30-4:30 pm, Colusa - Explorit Science Center will bring a hands-on spider lesson, story time and activity stations for all school-age children.

April 25, 6:30-7:30 pm, Colusa - Family Story Time will feature a story about young E. B. White, A Boy, a Mouse, and a Spider.

April 26, 11:00-12:30 and 1:00-2:30, Colusa - Movies! Bring snacks and a pillow for a *Charlotte's Web* movie marathon at the library featuring the 1973 animated classic followed by the beloved 2006 live action feature film.

RECOMMENDED READS



Written by E.B. White and illustrated by Garth Williams, Charlotte's Web tells the story of Wilbur, a little pig who is saved from an untimely death by his clever spider friend Charlotte and their chatty barnyard neighbors. Lessons of friendship, truth, and loyalty bind this story together and show that friends come in all shapes and sizes. Charlotte's Web is considered a classic of children's literature, enjoyable to adults as well as children. In 2000. Publishers Weekly listed it as the best-selling children's paperback of all time.

The US has the highest rate of

incarceration in the world. One in every 15 people born here is expected to go to prison. For black men this figure rises to 1 in 3. Bryan Stevenson grew up poor in the racially segregated South. His innate sense of justice made him a brilliant young lawyer, and one of his first defendants was Walter McMillian, a black man sentenced to die for the murder of a white woman - a crime he insisted he didn't commit. The case drew Bryan into a tangle of conspiracy, political machination, startling racial inequality, and legal brinks-

manship, and transformed his understanding of mercy and justice.
