

# COLUSA COUNTY 2025 GENERAL CONDITIONS

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## NOTICE OF INTENT FOR APPLICATION OF RESTRICTED MATERIALS

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All restricted materials require a 24 hour notice of intent (Under some conditions a 48 hour notice is required). A Notice of Intent (NOI) may be sent by:

If the application does not begin within 4 days of the proposed application date on an NOI, then you must submit a new NOI with the new proposed application date.

- All Non-Ag Applications of restricted materials are required to submit an NOI for their first application of the calendar year.
- All Commodity fumigations, aluminum phosphide applications and usage of squirrel baits must fill out a scheduled NOI when renewing their permit.

\* Please Note – A Notice Of Application (NOA) is ONLY necessary for the application of Thiobencarb on rice.

## PESTICIDE USE REPORTING

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-All grower-applied pesticides (any chemicals applied for pest control that have an EPA Number) must be reported to the County Agriculture Commissioner by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month following the application. This includes all restricted, non-restricted and organic certified chemicals applied to production agricultural crops.

-All applications made by Pest Control Businesses must be reported to the County Agricultural Commissioner within 7 days of application.

-Pesticide Use Reports may be submitted electronically through Agrian, CDMS or other software. They may also be submitted in person, by fax or email (at the same numbers mentioned above).

## PESTICIDE RELATED ILLNESSES AND ACCIDENTAL SPILLS

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-All suspected pesticide illnesses or accidental spills shall be reported to the Agricultural Commissioner immediately. The Agricultural Commissioner has the responsibility to conduct an investigation as pesticides may pose a hazard to people, animals, property and the environment.

## PESTICIDE STORAGE AND CONTAINER DISPOSAL

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-All pesticides must be stored in a locked enclosure with proper signage, separate from PPE. Storage location must not be within a residence or an attached portion of a residence. Do not store chemicals near a well site.

-Empty pesticide containers must be triple rinsed and all foil seals completely removed. To dispose of pesticide containers at the Maxwell Transfer Station, a Colusa County Ag Biologist must inspect the containers and issue a certificate of cleanliness, prior to disposal. To request an inspection call the Ag Office during normal business hours.

## PESTICIDES NEAR SCHOOLS

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Annual notifications for any sites applying chemicals within ¼ mile of schools are due before April 30, 2025 for the 2025/2026 school year.

## BEE CHECKS THROUGH BEEWHERE

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All bee checks are done through the BeeWhere website ([www.beewhere.calagpermits.org](http://www.beewhere.calagpermits.org)).
