With input from their communities, these organizations will develop a Regional Flood Management Plan by mid-2015 that defines the long-term vision for flood risk reduction. The plan will include:

- Current state of flood risk conditions and management within the Region
- Flood protection opportunities and problems
- Potential projects and priorities
- Financial plan

The plan will be designed to promote integrated regional flood management. It will also identify projects for future state and federal funding.
