IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF CITY MEASURE C

The Colusa City Council has placed Measure C on the November 4, 2008 ballot asking voters whether the office of the City Clerk for the City of Colusa shall be appointed by the City Council. The office of the City Clerk is currently an elected position.

The California Government Code provides that the office of the City Clerk may either be an elected position, or a position which is appointed by the City Council. An appointed City Clerk would serve at the pleasure of the City Council, and would not be required to be a resident or elector in the City. An elected City Clerk is required to be a resident and elector in the City.

A "yes" vote is a vote in favor of making the City Clerk an appointed position. A "no" vote is a vote against making the City Clerk an appointed position. If a majority of the voters voting on Measure C vote "yes", then the City Clerk will become an appointed position, and the City Council will appoint a City Clerk at the expiration of the term of the City Clerk now in office, or upon a vacancy in the office of the City Clerk.
