

IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS - STONYFORD

On November 6, 1984, in a duly conducted election, the voters of the then proposed Stonyford Recreation and Park District voted to form the district and set an annual appropriation limit of \$10,000.00. The voters also elected a Board of Directors.

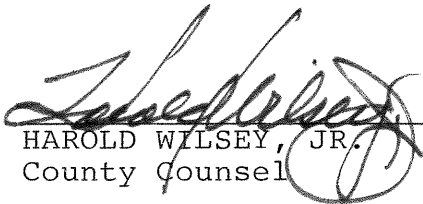
The third measure on the ballot which provided for an annual assessment in order to fund the projects for the district failed to receive the necessary two-thirds affirmative vote.

The district is now formed and the appropriation limit of \$10,000.00 per year is still in effect but the district has no operating funds or any way to raise them.

The measure now submitted to the voters by the Board of Directors is identical to the one which was defeated in the November, 1984 election.

A "yes" vote on this measure would allow the district to raise up to \$10,000.00 per year in the manner described in the measure. Any amounts collected in excess of \$10,000.00 would be returned to the taxpayers of the district.

A "no" vote would deny the authority to make the assessment as described and the district would continue to be without funds.
