## Coming to a Branch Near You...

**ZIP BOOKS!** 

The Colusa County Free Library is now offering *Zip Books*, a project funded by the California State Library through a grant from the Library Services and Technology Act! *Zip Books* allows librarians to pull from the "shelves" of Amazon.com when a book is requested by the public that is not part of our collection.

Using a "buy vs. borrow" model, Zip Books is an alternative to traditional interlibrary loans. It is a cost-effective method to secure the books you want to read, and has a much quicker turnaround time for patrons to receive the requested materials. Requests are reviewed by library staff, and if approved are ordered from Amazon and sent directly to the patron's home. Once the book has been read, or heard in the case of an audiobook, it is returned to the local library branch.

The program allows only one item per Zip Books request, but once the book or audio book is returned to the library, another request can be made. We ask only that you return the Zip Book directly to library staff. We will then either add

your *Zip Book* to the collection, or offer it to the Friends of the Library to be sold at the Bookworm.

There is no cost to patrons to "check out" a book through *Zip Books*, and all Colusa County Free Library members are encouraged to participate in the program provided any fines and/or fees they owe to the Library are less than \$5.00.

Zip Books requests must be made in person at any of the seven Colusa County Free Library branches, and participants are asked to return the item directly to a library staff member rather than using the book drop.

The Zip Books program includes new and used regular or large print books or audiobooks that are available on Amazon.com. Zip Book item value is limited to \$35. E-books, music, videos and DVDs are not available through the Zip Books program.

# What's New at the Library?

We are kicking off the New Year with several exciting new programs! Public libraries have traditionally offered early literacy programming to children in the form of story times. Through the use of a wide range of high-quality picture books, songs, poetry, finger plays, puppets and crafts, public libraries have helped make literacy accessible and fun. For decades, the main branch of the Colusa County Free Library system has served an average of 25 children ranging from ages birth-12 at its weekly Thursday night story time. In fact, story time has continued to be one of the library's most popular and successful programs.


By capturing a child's interest and imagination from an early age, story time helps them to discover that libraries and literacy can be an enjoyable and valued part of their lives. Young children who participate in story time, become regular library users and begin

to develop the early education, communication and social skills which are essential aspects of long-term literacy and reading comprehension skills. As such, we are happy to be extending story time to **ALL SEVEN** branch locations!

At the main branch in Colusa we are launching TWO new weekly story times and a monthly youth book club. *Rhyme Time* will focus on finger play and nursery rhymes for babies and toddlers, ages o-3 and their caregivers, while *Sensory Story Time* will host a limited number of kids with special needs and their caregivers in a calm, quiet area of the library.

On the fourth Saturday of each month, tweens ages 10-12 are invited to join Children's Librarian Lupe Ramos in a monthly book club! The first selection will be: *Holes*, by Louis Sachar. Books will be provided by the library.

These programs will add to the rich



opportunities kids have at the library, joining the Raising a Reader program, Cuentos, Story Time, and the Funky Junk afterschool program!

# **Grimes Branch Library**

**BRANCH SPOTLIGHT** 

Founded in 1851 by Cleaton Grimes, the town of Grimes was one of the first settlements in Colusa County. Likewise, in 1916, the Grimes Branch Library was opened becoming the first library branch outside of the county seat in Colusa. The branch was originally housed within the Nylo Ice Cream Parlor, and was hosted in several homes and businesses before the current location at 240 Main Street was built and opened in 1983.

For more than 38 years the branch was run by local resident Rose Ann Ellis who continues to volunteer her time there. Following her retirement in 2015,

Juana Rodriguez took charge of the branch. Interacting with large groups of kids who visit the branch after school and assisting non-English speaking patrons with computer usage are among the many aspects of her job that she loves.

The Grimes Branch Library is excited to announce it will have weekly story time beginning in January 2018 and will host the Raising A Reader Program February 2 through April 6, on Fridays from 10-10:45am. The Grimes branch is open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:00-7:00pm. For more information, contact the branch at 437-2428.

# Raising A Reader Program Now Enrolling

COLUSA COUNTY FREE LIBRARY LITERACY PROGRAM

Raising A Reader is back at the library! This 10-week storytime and booklending program for children ages birth-5 and their parents/caregivers is currently enrolling for its spring session at the Colusa, Grimes, Maxwell, Stonyford, and Williams branch libraries. Modeled after First 5 Colusa's Talk, Read, Sing campaign, participants socialize, sing nursery rhymes, read stories, and take home a weekly book bag full of library books. The program culminates with a Raising A Reader graduation ceremony, and free books provided by the Colusa County Free Library Literacy Program and First 5 Colusa. A free parent workshop about best reading practices is also available to caregivers at the end of the 10-week session, in addition to weekly educational coaching handouts.


"It's never too early to read to your child," stated Raising A Reader Program Implementer Alissa Morrow. "What's great about the program is that not only do the children socialize, get familiar with their local library, and learn along the way, but it's also a great way for parents in the community to meet each other and support one another. The benefits reach the children and parents simultaneously."

The Literacy Program is currently accepting Raising A Reader enrollments from January 2-February 9 for the Colusa, Grimes, Maxwell, and Williams branches, and from January 2-March 9 for the Stonyford branch. The spring session schedule is as follows:

Thursdays, February 1-April 5 Colusa, 10:00-10:45am Maxwell, 11:30am-12:15pm

Fridays, February 2-April 6 Grimes, 10:00-10:45am Williams, 11:30am-12:15pm

Saturdays, February 24-April 28 Stonyford, 9:30am-10:15am To register your child, visit your local branch library or contact the Raising A Reader Program Implementer at the Colusa branch at 458-0373. Enrollment is capped at 15 children per branch, and spots will be granted on a first come first served basis. Raising A Reader is funded by Raising A Reader National, First 5 Colusa, Umpqua Bank, and the Colusa County Free Library Literacy Program. Don't delay; enroll your child in this educationally enriching program today!
