

happening at the library...

maximizing space, tinyville town and more!

The main branch of the library was recently selected to participate in the **Maximizing Learning Spaces Project**. The project is a collaboration between the California State Library and Southern California Library Cooperative that provides an opportunity for libraries to maximize their potential as places of learning, literacy, and reading.

Fondly nicknamed "MacGuyvering Your Library," the purpose of the project is to make a few small but significant changes to the layout of the library, using the space and materials on hand, in order to make a large impact on how the space is used. We have been working with designer Diane Lam to maximize our space and improve its usability. As part of the grant, we were awarded \$5000 in new furnishings to help transform the main floor of the library.

While the immediate needs and restrictions of our space were the primary focus, we were able to create an aspirational redesign of the library that will provide us with a starting point for future expansion, should the opportunity arise.

In honor of the City of Colusa's 150th Anniversary, the Colusa County Free Library will be hosting a special six-week story time from May 8-June 12 using the popular children's book series *Tinyville Town*. Each Tuesday evening at 6:30, we will highlight a different member of our community, including a police officer, firefighter, veterinarian, mail carrier, the mayor, and the librarian. Crafts and activities will help to celebrate and illuminate the services and people who make up our community.

book your summer:


summer reading programs for all ages!

This summer is chockablock full of fun programming for readers of all ages and abilities! The theme: *Reading Takes You Everywhere* has lent itself to a wide variety of self-directed and group programs.

The benefits of summer reading are clear. National research from Dominican University finds that students who participate in public library summer reading programs scored higher on reading achievement tests at the beginning of the next school year than those who did not participate. Likewise, parents of children enrolled in the public library summer reading program reported that their children spent more time reading over the summer, read more confidently and more books overall, and were well prepared for school in the fall.

Young people experience learning losses when they don't engage in educational activities during the summer. Research spanning 100 years shows that students typically score lower on standardized tests at the end of summer vacation than they do on the same tests at the beginning of the summer. Furthermore, children who are read to in the home and who use the library perform better in school and are more likely to continue to use the library as a source of lifetime learning. The amount of time children spend reading outside of school is linked to gains in reading achievement.

To succeed in school and life, children




and young adults need ongoing opportunities to learn and practice essential skills. Summer reading programs remind kids that reading is for fun—as well as for learning. There's so much to see, so much to do at your library! There's no better place to take your kids.

As such, we have developed FIVE summer reading programs! New this summer, we will be offering a weekly program, Little Sprouts, for preschoolers, ages o-5. Each Monday, from 11:00-noon, at the main branch in Colusa, the kids will visit different aspects of farm life through age appropriate books and activities! This program made possible through funding from Colusa CAPC and the Colusa County Free Library Literacy Program. Registration begins May 21.

Children in grades k-5 are encouraged to enroll in our travel themed **Summer Reading Program**. Hosted at all of the seven branch locations, the participants will travel the world, collecting stamps in their passports; learn about different continents, countries and cultures. There is even a special trip out of this world and beyond planned! The annual SRP is sponsored by the Friends of the Library. Registration begins May 7.

To encourage familiarity with the library and its extensive collections, we have developed a self-directed library scavenger hunt: Where in the World is Casey Colusa? Kids, ages 6-12 will use clues to search the library for the ever elusive Casey Colusa. Each week, new clues will be provided. Those who find Casey will be entered into a drawing for weekly prizes and a grand prize for completing all 8 weeks!

Back by popular demand, the Colusa County Free Library Literacy Program is offering a **Book to Movie Club!** Ten participants (ages 10-17) will get copies of three books to read and discuss in weekly meetings at the Colusa Branch. After each title is completed, the movie



adaptations will be viewed, and attendees will compare and contrast versions of the stories—that of screen vs. book.

Summer 2018's chosen tomes are Wonder by RJ Palacio, Matilda by Roald Dahl, and the graphic novel version of A Wrinkle in Time by Madeleine L'Engle. The Book to Movie Club will meet Wednesdays from 1:00pm-2:00pm, starting June 13 through August 1. Registration begins May 14. This program sponsored by Premier Mushrooms, Inc.

This summer we are happy to feature a self-read road trip across the **United States of YA** for our teen patrons. Fifty books, each set in one of the fifty states have been selected and will encourage teens to visit different parts of our country through the lens of fiction.

In addition, we will continue to offer Cuentos, Thursday-night Story Time, Spectrum Story Time and Sensational Saturday's at the main branch in order to provide as many opportunities for participation as possible.

Also be on the lookout for displays and special programming that feature the summer theme for patrons of all ages. Even our weekly crafts and a few special Self Organized Learning Experiences are being adapted to take you to another place or time. Updates will be featured on our website, Facebook page and new monthly program calendar available at the circulation desk. You never know where a book will lead you.

adult literacy:

Conversation Club, U.S. Citizenship Workshop & Career Online High School

Beginning June 19, the Colusa County Free Library Literacy Program will be offering a free 8-week **English Learner Conversation Club** for adults who would like to practice their English speaking skills.

Each Tuesday from 5:30-6:30pm at the Colusa Branch, a different topic found in the four spheres of adult literacy (lifelong learning, family, the workplace, and community involvement) will be discussed.

The English Learner Conversation Club will end on August 7, and learners who would like to continue practicing their English speaking, reading, or writing skills, will be encouraged to register for one-on-one tutoring with the Literacy Coordinator. All instruction in the Conversation Club will be in English, but participants only need a basic understanding to attend.

If you missed out on the highly-attended **United States Citizenship Workshop**

on February 27 at the Colusa Branch, don't worry! The Colusa County representative from the United States Citizenship & Immigration Services Department will be returning for a free repeat engagement on June 30 from 10:00am-12:00pm at the Colusa Branch.

In the workshop, participants will learn about the naturalization process, the naturalization test, and the rights and responsibilities of U.S. citizenship.

Additionally, attendees will go home with free study materials and brochures, witness a mock interview, and have the ability to get any and all questions they may have about citizenship answered. There is no registration required for this free workshop.

Beginning mid-April, the Colusa County Free Library will begin offering **Career Online High School (COHS)**. COHS provides adults the opportunity to earn an accredited high school diploma and career certificate online. The Library's pilot program provides a limited number of scholarships to qualified adult learners who are looking to advance their careers, prepare for workforce entry or continue their education.

COHS is open to all eligible Colusa County residents, 19 and older. Applicants who successfully complete an online self-assessment and prerequisite course, followed by an in-person interview, will be considered for enrollment.

Once enrolled, COHS will pair each student with an online academic coach, who will provide the student with an individual career path, offer ongoing guidance, evaluate performance and connect the student with the resources needed to master the courses. Students will be given up to 18 months to complete the program.
